6.0	Report from the Dean	L. Johnston	<ul> <li>COUPN/CASN/CNO/Government Updates</li> <li>The crisis in the nursing workforce continues to be a focus of attention for the federal and provincial governments, the regulator and professional associations. An HHR strategy is being developed in the Ministry of Health and will have a number of components designed to address the current nursing workforce shortage. This includes approaches to retention, the "As of Right" legislation, fast-tracking internationally educated nurses, better compensation, and increasing seats in PN, BScN and NP academic programs.</li> <li>The Faculty has been allocated a further 25 BScN seats taking our intake to 231 in the Fall of 2023. We are currently working with the University to identify resources available to support that increase.</li> <li>We have also been allocated a further 20 seats in the NP program also commencing Fall 2023.</li> <li>CASN recently held a forum to discuss challenges in clinical placements across Canada and has released an updated framework for Nursing Education.</li> <li>The College of Nurses of Ontario is again addressing RN scope of practice</li> </ul>	

			with a renewed focus on RN prescribing. There is also an upcoming review of scope of practice for NPs.  TAHSN/Clinical Practice Updates  TAHSN practice subcommittee has undertaken a project in collaboration with Prof Linda McGillis Hall to explore the impact of alternative models of care in the ICU and a manuscript has been submitted for publication.  The committee is also continuing to develop guidelines for scope of practice of clinical externs.  TAHSNp panel for Nursing Week with the federal and provincial chief nurses as speakers on Thursday 11 May.  University of Toronto Updates  University budget passed through governance with ongoing tuition freeze imposed by gov. – creating financial challenges for divisions, Nursing included.  LSBFON Updates  SAMIH planning is continuing – established WG's in the Academic Planning Table; meetings with builder and architects.  Preliminary discussions with UTM and Trillium HP re: BScN programming at UTM.  Recruiting for teaching stream faculty. Need to search for more tenure and teaching stream faculty – with increased seats.  New CAO starting on April 3rd.  Director, Office of the Dean scheduling and running UTQAP consultations.  Planning for Nursing week is close to finalized. Guest speaker Sheila Tlou will give a public address and will meet with UG and grad students.
