5.0	Report from the Acting Dean	R. Stremler	Pleased to be the Acting Dean. Search for new Dean is actively underway. Thank you to Kim Widger who is serving as Acting Associate Dean Academic through June and Samantha Mayo who is serving as Acting Director Doctoral Programs COUPN/CASN/CNO/Government Updates • Last year's expansion of NP seats from 100 to 120 was a one-time only expansion. For the 2024-25 intake cycle we will seek to fill 100 NP seats. • Seats in the UG program remain at 231 • The Federal Chief Nurse's Nursing Retention Toolkit is available online • TAHSNp is engaged in surveying members to determine which of the priorities and initiatives will be pursued by the group. • The Ministry of Health approved regulations for RN prescribing on November 6, 2023. In December, the Council started approving RN prescribing education programs in Ontario. If an RN has completed the education approved by the Council, their practice environment must allow for prescribing RN's. • Blue Ribbon Panel report released in November. Recommended that gov. raise grants to universities by 10% and tuition should rise by 5% immediately. We are waiting for the official government announcement. Some institutions face significant deficits, but U of T is in a good financial position. • Ottawa has announced it will cap the number of PSE international student visas and Immigration Canada student visa processes is on hold until March 31st. pending an agreement on how to move forward. U of T has been assured by the government that grad students will be exempt. At Bloomberg Nursing we have a small number of international students in the UG program – so impact minimal. U of T will have increased outreach to international applicants as the study permit process becomes more clear.
