- Funding for the enhanced extern program extended for another year with conversations about possibly replacing clinical placements externships in academic programs.
- No messaging on seat expansion for BScN or NP programs.
- CASN has been working with TAHSN hospitals regarding the potential for the Nurse Residency program to assist new grads transition into their role post licensure.
- CNO slowly developing framework for nurse prescribing no timeline for launch.
