




Clinical Placements

- Year 1 (starting fall semester): older person care, adult medicine/surgery, pediatrics, childbearing persons & families
- Year 2: community/primary health care, mental health, various acute care areas, final integrative practicum (IP) (choice of clinical setting/area)
- Clinical on weekdays and weekends; days and evenings (potential for night shifts in final IP); 8- and 12-hr shifts
- Travel Time: Up to two hours each way using Faculty as starting point
- Students are responsible for all costs associated with travel to and from placement
- Students supervised in clinical setting by Clinical Instructor or Preceptor

World Class Researchers

- Student opportunities to engage with world-class faculty
- Rosenstadt Research Development Program (RRDP) for BScN students (open to Year 1 and 2 students)
- Hub for innovation across all domains including simulation and teaching tools/techniques

Admission and Eligibility Requirements



Do you need...?





to pass the CASPer test to apply for the UofT BScN program?



to complete your undergraduate degree before applying?



to submit references and complete an interview with the U of T BScN Admissions Committee?



to have volunteer experience within healthcare?



to major in Health Sciences or Life Sciences to be eligible for U of T's BScN program?

Who can apply?



Undergraduate students in the process of completing their second, third or fourth year or graduate students completing their Master's or Doctorate programs



Applicants with an undergraduate degree who are in the workforce and are looking to change career paths



Students from any discipline can apply

Minimum Admission Requirements



COMPLETION OF AT LEAST 10.0* CREDITS FROM A RECOGNIZED UNIVERSITY PROGRAM



ON TRACK TO COMPLETE PREREQUISITE COURSES BY JUNE 30, 2025



MINIMUM OF 4.0 CREDITS MUST BE ABOVE THE 100/FIRST YEAR LEVEL OF STUDY



AT LEAST A MID-B AVERAGE (APPROX. 75% OR 3.0 ON A 4.0 GPA SCALE) IN MOST RECENT 5.0 CREDITS

*Note: a 1.0 credit is a full-year course at U of T (e.g. starting from September until the following April)



Pre-requisite Courses

Must achieve at least 60%/C-

1.0 credit in Human Physiology (HP)

or

0.5 credit in HP + 0.5 credit in Human Anatomy

Courses can be completed at any — undergraduate level

1.0 credit in Social Sciences

1.0 credit in Life Sciences or Physical Sciences

1.0 credit in Humanities

0.5 credit in Statistics

0.5 credit in Microbiology





Additional Requirements



Supplementary Application Form

- Personal Statement: strength/skills, interest in nursing/health care
- Leadership/community involvement: volunteer experiences, campus involvement, etc.
- Personal milestones and achievements, lived experiences, etc.
- Available through the Join U of T Portal





Priority Pathway for Indigenous Students

- For applicants who identify as First Nations (status, non-status, treaty or non-treaty), Métis, and Inuit
- Admissions decisions based on individual qualifications rather than in relation to other applicants
- Reviewers include Indigenous community members
- Submit documentation supporting Indigenous identity along with academic and supplementary application
- Two Indigenous Nursing Student Scholarships available: \$10,000 total value over 2 years (\$5,000 per year)





How to Apply



Step 1

OUAC 105

- New students to the University of Toronto
- Ontario Universities' Application Centre
 (OUAC) 105 Application Form
- Application fee: \$156 (3 institutions)

OR

Internal U of T application

- Previously/currently registered University of Toronto student will complete the <u>U of T</u> Internal Application
- Application Fee: \$94

- If you submitted an application through OUAC,
 wait 3-7 business days to receive your link to
 the portal and your applicant number via email
- √ Submit pre-requisite course descriptions/outlines
- ✓ Submit transcript(s)
- √ Personal Statements
- √Proof of English proficiency test (if required)

Deadline to apply in order to be considered for Bloomberg BScN awards: January 15, 2025




Indigenous Tuition Initiative

- The U of T Indigenous Tuition Grant covers the cost of tuition in eligible undergraduate and graduate programs for students from the nine identified First Nations communities
- Indigenous students from the rest of Canada and Native American/Alaska Native students from the continental U.S.A. may be eligible for domestic Ontario tuition fee
